### **From our last committee meeting**

Finance – all 2017 accounts have been reviewed and a statement of the accounts has been attached to an email to Club members advising them of the AGM on 23 February. Playing in separate rooms has been successful and will continue if table numbers warrant it. Lizzie – mentoring newbies and Dinah - convening Mondays is working well and will continue – William Wallace will also continue coming before play on Monday to set up tables. Alan congratulated Lizzie for all the work she has done with the beginners.

**Supper list** Club members have been great at accepting the new system, and have either done it themselves or arranged their own substitutes. ( Thank you!!) Jill Thomas is now purchasing the tea, coffee, biscuits etc\_ as the Rapsons are involved in the\_Dealing.

**Nesting Pairs** We have talked about this twice in the newsletter but as there were only three pairs interested in taking up Nesting Pairs it is not viable to hire the club rooms and arrange to have the extra boards dealt, so unfortunately it will not go ahead as a club activity. 



### Mindy's workshop is for Intermediate Players

only take one or two really slow players to alter the night's experience for everyone.

Of course we all play at different speeds but the realities of a room full of tables means that players need to bid and play in a steady rhythm.

Our SWBC directors let the room know the time allotted for each board and try to be realistic noting that Monday night players need a little more time than Thursday nights. As a rule, each hand is expected to be played in 6 minutes.

- Directors do have the ability to penalize for slow play, but the club's preference is that we all self manage. You as players can help the director by handling your cards efficiently at the start of play. This may mean reviewing the practice of picking up each card one by one, a very slowing procedure. Some practice at home, and a cardholder (club can provide) may help.
- Planning your play as declarer when dummy goes down. It is no use playing half the cards and then spending 5 minutes wondering how to get back into dummy.
- Following the director's call to move quickly with only East lingering to input the score. This is not the time to review boards; cards only need a small reshuffle.


## Introducing the Connelly Laminated Score Sheet

**Written by Martin Connelly – mentor of the Novice Interclub team**

“The decision to create something like this for the Novice team, and others, was because of my own reflections when I first played Interclub Bridge. I had not realised that we would have to keep the score on paper. That was a shock, then another shock came my way when I tried to write on the score-sheet and the pencil just went through the paper because of the soft material underneath. And if that was not bad enough, when I realised that there was a score sheet on the table – well the other side wanted it to write on so that their pencil would not go through the paper, and asking to see what it said just kept taking up time. So, when we are not sure about the scoring or how “Interclub Teams” works – it helps if we all have our own score-sheet.

I also noticed, several times, that when people do not know how to score in their heads and when the other team gets to the score-sheet first that many people ask their opponenet what the score should be. Big Mistake. Never ask the opponent what they want the score to be – if they have made a mistake you are just copying it. Any mistakes will always favour them, you can place a bet on it.”

**The Club has laminated 50 copies of the Connelly Score Sheet – they are available to all Interclub Teams and also very helpful if you play Social Bridge. If you would like one contact Lizzie.**
