### **From The Committee meeting:-**

- **Financial** – Kath filling in for Alan presented a comprehensive Financial Report by email. As part of the report there was a breakdown of the Income and expenditure of the Tournament. We made a profit of \$21.36(including raffle profit of \$150.00) Kath thanked Hugh for his work in helping counting and sorting the money on the day of the tournament
- Balances as at the end of April Current A/c \$9232.64. Savings A/c \$2276.75, Term Deposit A/c \$20, 480. Balance less outstanding cheques \$30,480.10
- **Tournament Review:-**Lizzie has set up a memory stick with all tournament duties. Thank you to Jill who loaned us her tables cloths and then took them home and washed them. Thank you to Ruth Burgess who took home our table cloths and bought them back clean and pressed
- **Monday and Thursday Reviews:-** Dinah and Katherine reported that no problems had been reported to them and everything seemed to be going well .A reminder to everyone – if you have any issues on the night you play bridge – let one of the convenors know so we can get it sorted out.
- **Greytown Sport and Leisure :-** Have changed the way they allocate bulk funding and asked us to supply certain documents before releasing funds Lizzie to write a Strategic Plan 2018, and Action Plan for 2018 and Kath will supply a Budget. We also need to supply Minutes from our AGM, Annual Report and Financial Statements and our Bank Account Number

## **SWBC 2018 Action Plan**

The SWBC elected committee has the responsibility to meet the 2018 club objectives to upskill and consolidate club membership.

**WORKSHOPS.** The following workshops have been held or are in the pipeline for 2018.

**March 10** Senior Wellington region bridge player and teacher, Mindy Wu held a three hour workshop with the focus on upskilling our Intermediate level players.

**April 14** We employed a senior Wellington Region Director, Allan Joseph, to hold a three hour workshop for our club directors with the focus on hands on experience using the Laws that govern all NZ duplicate bridge play.

**June 23** A workshop planned for Mindy Wu to work again with the SWBC Intermediate level players.

**October** (date to be confirmed) Allan Joseph workshop for club directors.

**Tuesday nights starting May 1<sup>st</sup>** the club is holding a series of ten refresher lessons with the focus on our Junior membership. The teaching in these lessons is provided by unpaid senior club members.

**PARTICIPATION IN WELLINGTON REGIONAL INTERCLUB COMPETITION.** The committee sees SWBC participation in the monthly Wellington Regional Interclub competition as an excellent form of upskilling membership. Members have been actively encouraged to form teams and participate with petrol funding made available. As a consequence of this approach, although one of the smallest clubs in the Wellington Region, the SWBC has, with **six** teams, one of the strongest participation presence. These teams include beginning (novice) bridge players.

## **PARTICIPATION IN THE NEW ZEALAND BRIDGE ASSOCIATION TOURNAMENT**

**ANNUAL CALENDAR (country wide).** The SWBC is part of this calendar holding two tournaments annually, a huge commitment for a small provincial club. The **April 15 2018** Junior and Intermediate level tournament attracted over 80 players from the Hawkes Bay and lower North Island. A second tournament is planned for **September 23**. As a Multigrade tournament it is expected to attract a greater number of players including Open players. These tournaments require a great deal of hard work to set up and hold. SWDC weekend costs for the hire of the Town Centre space are considerable. Plus the costs of hiring a senior director from Wellington to oversee play and provision of food during the day.

Justification is the experience and confidence building our members gain in the competition and the exposure given to our club.

**THE PIANOLA BRIDGE SYSTEM** . Recognising that our membership is almost entirely computer savvy and as a consequence of having knowledgeable and forward thinking skills within the club the SWBC has been innovative in purchasing the Pianola system. This is a set of tools that allows members to view their bridge results in new and innovative ways enabling them to analyse play and trends over time. Pianola also empowers members to find partners and has numerous other features. 2018 the club has taken the further step to subsidise use of Pianola Plus.

**COMMUNICATION** The committee views open communication and open governance as a key part of our 2018 action plan. Extensive use is made of Pianola to send messages to membership and we have a monthly Newsletter highlighting club activities/ feedback of committee decisions and discussion.

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Our Supper Roster is working really well – **thank you** everybody for taking your turn or arranging for someone else to do it for you.


**Thank you** also to Jill who is doing a great job of buying supper supplies
